

HRAWI Conducts FSSAI FoSTaC Training Programme in Advance Catering in Mumbai

The Hotel and Restaurant Association (Western India) (HRAWI), in collaboration with the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), conducted a Food Safety Supervisor Training Programme in Advance Catering on Tuesday, 4 August 2026, at Hotel Le Grande, Andheri East, Mumbai.

The training programme was attended by 50 hospitality professionals from the industry and focused on strengthening participants' understanding of food safety, hygiene and compliance requirements in catering operations.

The programme was conducted by Dr. V. Pasupathy, Food Safety Expert and FoSTaC Diamond Trainer, who guided participants through various aspects of food safety management and the responsibilities of food safety supervisors. The sessions provided participants with practical insights into maintaining food safety standards and implementing effective hygiene practices within hospitality establishments.

A key highlight of the programme was the practical demonstration involving commonly used kitchen ingredients. The demonstration enabled participants to gain a better understanding of food safety considerations in day-to-day kitchen operations and provided an interactive dimension to the training.

The programme also included an assessment/examination, enabling participants to evaluate their understanding of the topics covered during the training. Successful participants were eligible for certification under the FSSAI FoSTaC programme.

The training forms part of HRAWI's continued efforts to promote food safety awareness, strengthen professional capabilities and encourage compliance with food safety standards across the hospitality industry. Through its FSSAI training initiatives, HRAWI continues to provide hospitality professionals with access to structured training and practical knowledge that can be implemented in their respective establishments.
