Tourism Ministry gets new Secretary as Srivatsa Krishna replaces V Vidyavathi

In a major bureaucratic reshuffle, the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has cleared several senior-level postings, including the appointment of Srivatsa Krishna, IAS (1994 batch, Karnataka cadre) as the new Secretary, Ministry of Tourism, Government of India.

He takes charge from V. Vidyavathi, IAS (1991 batch, Karnataka cadre), who has been posted as Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities under the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment.

Srivatsa Krishna brings to the position an impressive mix of academic excellence and administrative experience. He holds a postgraduate degree in International Studies from Jawaharlal Nehru University, an MBA from Harvard University, and a PhD in Management from IIT Madras. Over the course of his career, he has served as Secretary, Commerce & Industry, Government of Karnataka, and has worked extensively across Urban Administration, e-Governance, and development sectors, in addition to professional experience with the World Bank Group.

Krishna was instrumental in shaping India's early e-governance movement and played a key role in the evolution of Cyberabad as a technology hub. He has also served as Chief Executive Officer and Secretary of the Coffee Board of India.

A distinguished civil servant, Krishna secured All India Rank 1 in the 1994 UPSC Civil Services Examination, famously choosing public service over a promising career in music. He was also the first IAS officer to complete an MBA from Harvard University.

His appointment is part of a broader set of organisational changes approved by the ACC, signalling leadership transitions across multiple ministries aimed at strengthening governance and accelerating policy delivery at the national level.
